Paula Szafranski, City Treasurer said the EBT machine for the program was given to the City at no cost by the USDA. The banners and flyers were provided by the state at no cost to the City. She said they would like to have a manager for the program which would keep City Staff from having to run the program on site.

The Council discussed with Paula how the program would work. Paula said the manager would not be paid by the City, but would be able to establish a fee that the vendors would pay if they want to participate in the farmers market. The manager would keep that fee much like the golf pro the City hires to run the golf course and the fee he charges and keeps for the driving range.

Councilman Bundy thanked Paula for all the work she has put into this and asked her to keep the Council apprised on how the hiring of the Fresh Friday Farmer's Market Manager is going.

Kyle Land, Fiber Optics Foreman gave an update on Mountain Home's Fiber Optic Project. He discussed with the Council a timeline for hooking up all the City's infrastructure to fiber optics.

Kyle Land, Fiber Optics Foreman gave an update on the County boring project and described the difficulty there has been getting through the ground out there.

Mayor Sykes said he was planning on bringing in Sawtooth Directional Drilling Company who will bring in their own reaming bits and the City fiber employees can train with them. The project should take the company forty hours or less.

Councilman Stokes asked how long the project is.

Kyle said it was 170 feet.

Councilman Brennan wanted to clarify the budget for the project would pay for the outside company coming in to do the job.

Mayor Sykes said it fell into the \$10,000.00 that was originally budgeted and approved for the boring project.

Courtney Lewis, Economic Development Director said Demetric Fane reached out because he was looking at expanding Sequel into another section of the City's Industrial Park. They would like to start with leasing half of the lot to the right of their existing lot to give additional recreation options for the students there. She said tonight, Sequel is asking the Council to split the lot and allow Sequel to lease half of it. The divisions wouldn't be permanent at this point.

Councilman Brennan asked if Sequel would be willing to walk away from everything if they chose not to continue their lease because the improvements would be on City land.

Demetric said yes the City would be able to use it as they see fit, if Sequel were for some reason to be unable to utilize the property in the future.

Councilman Bundy said he would be in favor of using the back half of the lot for Sequel's recreation purposes for the time being.

Courtney said she had spoken with City Clerk, Nina Patterson about aligning the lease for the additional property with the lease for the property Sequel currently sits on.

Councilman Bundy made a motion to approve bringing a lease back to the Council and leasing additional industrial park property to Sequel TSA of Idaho, LLC. Councilman McCain seconded the motion.

The maximum for the new position currently would be \$92,000.00.

Paula Szafranski, City Treasurer said since this job would also encompass the planner job it would be partially paid out of Water and Waste
