The Council of the City of Mountain Home, Elmore County, Idaho, met at Mountain Home City Hall, 160 South $3^{\rm rd}$ East, Mountain Home, Idaho on April $20^{\rm th}$, 2020. A quorum was established with Councilman Brennan, Councilman Stokes, Councilman McCain, Councilman Bundy and Mayor Sykes being present at 10:00 a.m.

<u>Discussion/Update - on Coronavirus Numbers</u>

Mayor Sykes went over the Coronavirus numbers. In the state there are 1,672 total cases, 21 total lab confirmed cases in Elmore County 1 probable and zero deaths as of this morning.

Renew Resolution - #10-20 - Continuing Support of Federal, State, County and Local Government Actions for containing, controlling and mitigating the spread of the Coronavirus and those affected by it. ACTION ITEM.

Councilman Bundy said this would go along with the Governor Little's Stay at Home order, he explained that while the resolution is for thirty days if Governor Little decided to lift his Stay at Home order sooner than thirty days the City would terminate the resolution at that time.

Councilman Bundy made a motion to renew Resolution - #10-20 - Continuing Support of Federal, State, County and Local Government Actions for containing, controlling and mitigating the spread of the Coronavirus and those affected by it and assign it as $\#10-20\,(A)$. Councilman McCain seconded the motion.

- Mayor Sykes said the Mountain Home School District was featured on the news for the innovative educator award and speedy way they were able to take children to an online platform in response to the pandemic. He thanked everyone who has donated to the food pantry he has setup.
- ullet Nina Patterson, City Clerk said 25 families have benefitted from the food pantry so far.
- Councilman McCain said he has been tracking the number of Coronavirus cases and in a week the state has gone up 219 cases and Elmore County has gone up 4 cases with another probable. He said this isn't over yet and he knows no one likes to stay home but they need to.
- Councilman Stokes said they are doing the Arbor Day tree drive thru service tomorrow at 11:00 a.m. in the Parks and Recreation parking lot. He said it will be contactless.

• Police Chief, Scott Conner said there has been a lot traffic but hopefully people are still maintaining social distance. He said there has been an increase of domestic calls with everyone cooped up but nothing too bad.
